BOOKS:

Vital Signs, Andy Thomas, 2002 – a complete and level-headed review to 2002. Andy is the powerhouse behind the Glastonbury Symposium.

The Greatest Mystery of Modern Times, Lucy Pringle, 1999 – Lucy, a prolific photographer, writes with enthusiasm, specializing on the effects of the formations on people. A thought provoking book.

Mysterious Lights and Crop Circles, Linda Moulton Howe, 2002 – This is only one of Linda's amazing output. It explores the light phenomena associated with crop formations.

Crop Circles: The Bones of God, Michael Glickman, 2009 – An architect and geometer with 20 years experience reflects on the phenomenon.

Crop Circles: Signs, Wonders and Mysteries, Steve and Karen Alexander, 2006 – A marvelous pictorial tour of the phenomenon, with a few strange omissions.

Crop Circles: Signs of Contact, Colin Andrews and Stephen Spignesi, 2004 – For a more critical review, here is one of the very first researchers, Colin Andrews, commenting on 21 years of crop circle investigation.

Crooked Soley: A Crop Circle Revelation, Allan Brown and John Mitchell, 2005 – Allan was my tour guide in 2003, and John Mitchell has been around forever, an expert on ancient metrology. This formation lasted only a couple of days, but the geometric and numerical analysis is superb. This gives one a feel for what is incorporated in the design of the circles.

Messages From Space, Jay Goldner, 2002 – Jay is a fascinating person, heavily involved in the unexplained. Here he elaborates on the Chilbolton formations, reputed to be an alien response to a message sent from the radio telescope in Arecibo, Puerto Rico, in 1974. Thought provoking.

The Hypnotic Power of Crop Circles, Bert Janssen, 2004 – A fascinating insight into the geometry and meaning of the formations – highly recommended.

Secrets in the Fields, Freddy Silva, 2002 – A comprehensive survey of the crop circle world.

Crop Circles – History, Research and Theory 2011, Eva-Marie Brekkesto

An up to date and comprehensive survey of the phenomenon by the founder of the Norwegian Crop Circle research Group.

DVD'S:

There are quite a few out there; here are two that are highly recommended (by me)

Crop Circles: Quest for Truth' William Gazecki, 2002 An intelligent and balanced review of the phenomenon, with most of the major players interviewed.

'What on Earth? – Inside the Crop Circle Mystery' Suzanne Taylor, 2009 – A more recent review, along the same lines as Gazecki, very well done, technically superb.
